Be sure to pick out a perfect specimen, then select others as similar as possible-choose same maturity. Protect from dirt, disease, infection and mechanical damage- choose specimens with no blemishes. Check premium requirements carefully-enter the number or amount required to avoid disqualification. Not responsible for entries after 10 PM on Saturday.
